FIELD TRIPS

The Society field trips offer an educational and fun opportunity to enjoy Minnesota’s wide variety of plant communities throughout the year. Trip leaders are knowledgeable about important features of each site.

EVENTS

Spring Symposium - explores issues related to native flora, co-sponsored by the Bell Museum of Natural History.

Spring Plant Sale - members share their extra seedlings and divisions raising money for the Society.

Fall Seed Exchange - members trade seed and information about habitat and cultivation.

PLANT PRESS NEWSLETTER

Minnesota Native Plant Society members receive the quarterly newsletter Minnesota Plant Press, which provides updates on rare species, summaries of current issues, meeting announcements, book reviews and other information.

COMMITTEES

Conservation Committee - Informs Society members about emerging issues affecting Minnesota’s rare and endangered species and their habitats, and promotes the use of native plants. The Society also gives annual grants for projects in line with the Society’s purpose.

MONTHLY MEETINGS

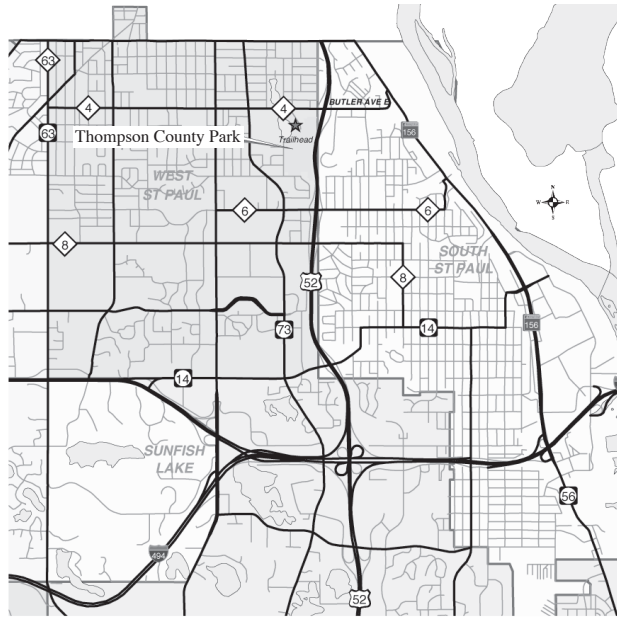
